Attendance and punctuality



Government departments track school attendance figures. We have a whole school attendance target which is 96.5%. Our attendance is currently at **94.9%** which has remained the same since I last wrote to you but still **below** our national target. **Can I please remind you that term-time holidays are not permitted**. Although improving, **lateness is still an issue** for some. Pre-school hourly rate is £5.00.

Government funding (nursery vouchers) for eligible 3- and 4-year-olds can be claimed for a maximum of 15 or 30 hours (where eligible) per week over 38 weeks of the year. Additional hours will be charged at £5.00 per hour.

Please can I remind you to book in advance using School Money – we understand if an emergency comes up, but we need to know numbers to ensure we have the correct staff ratios.

Please can I also remind you to pay when you make your booking. We understand that the cost of living is high, but it makes life more challenging if you end up in arrears. We don't want to turn away children, but we cannot accept your children until all outstanding payments are made. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.
