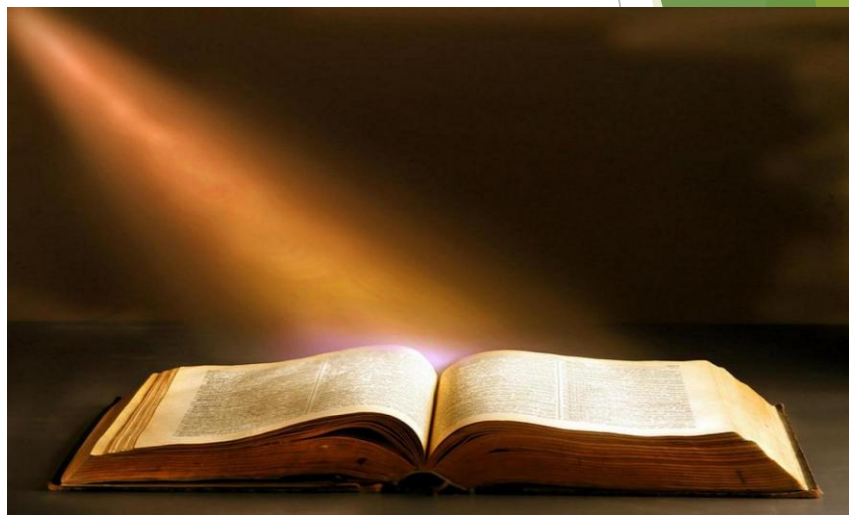

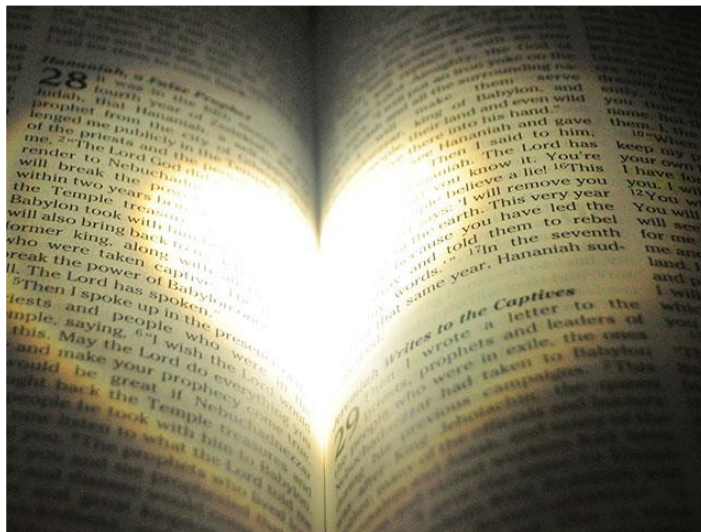

What do you remember from the reading today?

Jesus is telling the disciples how he wants them to be. He asks them to be good to everyone, even those who hate them.

He asks them to treat everyone as they would want to be treated.



He asks them not to judge other people, to be kind and compassionate, and to forgive those who hurt them.

And he also asks them to be generous. To give what they have to anyone who asks them.

We can give people our love, our time, our friendship, our kindness. We can give them comfort when they are sad.



This year is a special Jubilee Year, when we are called to try to share hope with others, especially those who are poor or who are treated unfairly in our world.



Jesus says that those of us who are generous will receive lots of gifts back.

This doesn't mean that we will get loads of presents.

It's not about getting more toys or sweets or things, but about being surrounded by love, peace, hope and joy.

These are really important gifts.

in Your peace.

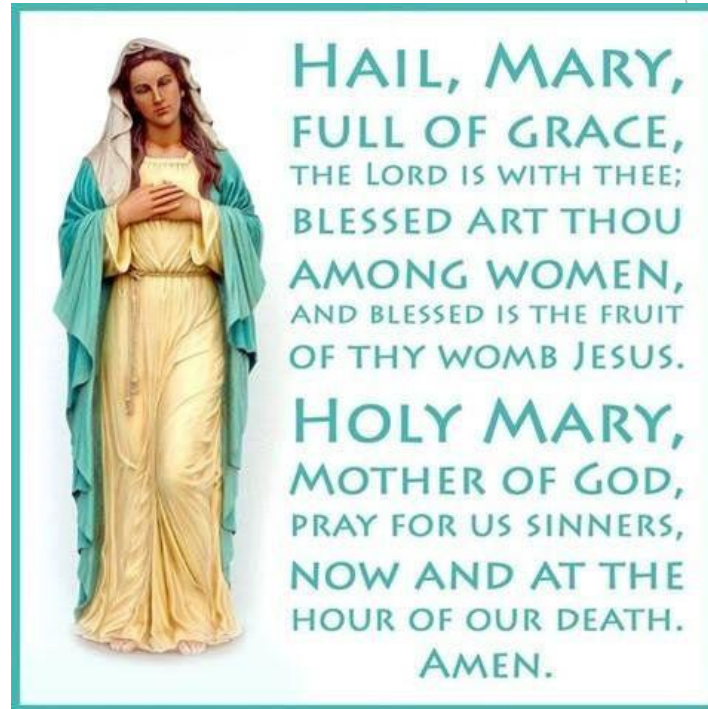
May Your will be done in his life, O Lord,
