

ACCESSIBILITY PLAN 2025 – 2027 St Mary's Catholic Primary School

- 1. This Accessibility Policy & Action Plan has been drawn up in consultation with the Multi Academy Trust, Local Authority, stakeholders and governors of the school and will advise other school planning documents. The Accessibility Action Plan will be reviewed annually and provide a projected plan for the three years period ahead of the review date.
- 2. The Accessibility Policy is structured to complement and support the school's Equality Objectives and will be published on the school website.
- 3. We are committed to providing an environment that enables full curriculum access that values and includes all pupils, staff, parents and visitors regardless of their education, physical, sensory, social, spiritual, emotional and cultural needs. We are committed to taking positive attitudes about disability and accessibility and to developing a culture of inclusion, support and awareness within the school.
- 4. St Mary's Catholic Primary School's Accessibility Action Plan shows how access is to be improved for disabled pupils, staff and visitors to the school in a given timeframe and anticipating the need to make reasonable adjustments to accommodate their needs where practicable. The Accessibility Action Plan will contain relevant actions to:
 - improve access to the physical environment of the school, adding specialist facilities as necessary. This covers improvements to the physical environment of the school and physical aids to access education;
 - increase access to the curriculum for pupils with a disability, expanding the curriculum as
 necessary to ensure that pupils with a disability are as, equally, prepared for life as are the
 able-bodied pupils; (If a school fails to do this they are in breach of duties under the Equalities
 Act 2010); this covers teaching and learning and the wider curriculum of the school such as
 participation in after-school clubs, leisure and cultural activities or school visits. It also covers
 the provision of specialist or auxiliary aids and equipment, which may assist these pupils in
 accessing the curriculum within a reasonable time frame;
 - improve the delivery of **written information** to pupils, staff, parents and visitors with disabilities. Examples might include handouts, timetables, textbooks and information about the school and school events; the information should be made available in various preferred formats within a reasonable time frame.
- 5. The Accessibility Plan relates to the key aspects of physical environment, curriculum and written information.



- 6. Whole school training will recognise the need to continue raising awareness for staff and governors on equality issues with reference to the Equality Act 2010.
- 7. The Accessibility Action Plan should be read in conjunction with the following policies, strategies and documents:

- 8. The Accessibility Plan for physical accessibility relates to the Access Audit of the School, which was originally undertaken by the Local Authority and subsequently updated by the school. It may not be feasible to undertake some of the works during the life of this first Accessibility Plan and therefore some items will roll forward into subsequent plans. The audit will need to be revisited prior to the end of each first three-year plan period in order to inform the development of the new Plan for the following period.
- 9. The Academy's complaints procedure covers the Accessibility Plan.
- 10. Information about our Accessibility Plan will be published on the school website.
- 11. The school will work in partnership with Plymouth CAST in developing and implementing this plan.
- 12. The Plan will be monitored by Ofsted under *Inspecting equalities* as part of their inspection cycle. The Chairs of Governors appreciate that the school could be judged inadequate by Ofsted if is unable to evidence promotion of disability equality.
