Sound System at Our Lady's

As you know, we are going to replace the sound system at Our Lady's. The delay is caused by the onerous system of permissions which need to be obtained from the diocese and from the Historic Churches Commission. This process is nearly completed, so this would be a good time to visit a church in which the kind of system we will be getting has been installed, so that we can experience what it sounds like.

The Anglican Church of the Holy Rood in Buckland Newton has kindly agreed to welcome us on Friday 2nd December at 11 a.m. Anyone who would like to attend is most welcome. It would be particularly helpful if people who have modern digital hearing aids were to join us, since the system, apparently, automatically connects with these. Fr. Francis can take three people with him.

The evangelisation group is planning an Open Church event at St. Benedict's on the last Sunday before Christmas, 18th December. This will involve inviting all and sundry to join them, votive candles, prayer support and generous listening. They are asking for volunteers to help with supervising candles, helping to write prayers, continuous prayer, controlling music and being warm and welcoming. They ask you to meet them at 2.15 p.m. for prayers and preparation. The plan is to finish at about 4 p.m. depending on what happens. They ask you to encourage friends and family of whatever persuasion to come along after 3 p.m. Please contact Tony Moore, Annette Lyons or Deacons Mike or James to offer help.

Last week, we celebrated Anti-Bullying Week. On Tuesday, the children took part in a whole school assembly. Each child had a puzzle piece template and wrote or decorated it to show how they help prevent bullying at St Mary's. They also discussed what makes a perfect friend (e.g. a big pair of ears to show they're a good listener, a big heart to show they care, hands for kindness, a watch because they always have time for them). During the week, the children were 'Secret Angels', where each child was given another child's name in secret. They then had to do lots of kind acts for them throughout the week (they could also be kind to other people so it didn't look obvious) and then on Friday they were supposed to reveal who their secret angel was; however this wasn't so successful – for a good reason! As our children are usually kind to each other, it was difficult to single out any one person! I think you'll agree, a lovely 'failure' to celebrate. The week culminated in the children 'reaching out' to children in need, by coming to school wearing pyjamas, a onesie or spotty clothes and brought a donation for Children in Need. Catholic international aid agencies in the UK say the British government's announcement that it wouldn't restore the overseas aid budget target to 0.7 percent of Gross National Income (GNI) is disappointing.

CAFOD director Christine Allen admitted it is difficult times for everyone, "which means difficult decisions must be made." But prioritizing spending in the UK, the country is "just robbing Peter to pay Paul."

"This approach fails to tackle the root causes of global injustice – which contributes to migration – and it's a mistake we will pay for further down the line. The UK can and must do better," she said.
