### **New Life!**

We have some new additions to our St Mary's family – 5 new chicks! Miss Gould has been looking after our eggs for 21 days now so it was thrilling to see them hatch! It's all been very 'eggsiting' watching the eggs start to wobble, hearing faint chirps, then a little crack, followed by a tiny beak poking through and finally freedom as the shell comes away from the tired little chick. Very soon after, the

chicks are up and some are still a bit wobbly, but the transformation a day later into little bundles of fluff. The children have all been keen to visit the eggs/chicks to see the progress made. These eggs were from the chicks we hatched last year, so it's great to see how the generations are thriving. It's now up to each class decide on a name for each of the chicks.

### **COVID-19 update**

As you know, there have been a couple of positive cases of COVID -19 this week. Please continue to be vigilant with regards to symptoms and your children feeling unwell. We are continuing to ensure everyone practises good hand and respiratory hygiene; we are ensuring good ventilation of indoor spaces and maintaining appropriate cleaning regimes. Currently the guidance is:

#### **Stay at home if you have COVID-19**

Although the legal requirement to self-isolate has ended, people who test positive for COVID-19 or have symptoms of the virus should continue to stay at home and avoid contact with other people.

Children and young people with COVID-19 should not attend their education setting while they are infectious. **They should take an LFD test from 5 days after their symptoms started** (or the day their test was taken if they did not have symptoms) followed by another one the next day. If both these tests results are negative, they should return to their educational setting if they normally attend one, as long as they feel well enough to do so and do not have a temperature. They should follow the guidance for their educational setting.

#### **Close contacts**

Close contacts of confirmed cases are no longer advised to take daily lateral flow tests, but they should take steps to reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19. [Read more about what to do if you are a close contact.](#)

#### **Testing**

The Government no longer recommends twice-weekly asymptomatic testing in mainstream education and childcare settings.

At present, anyone with symptoms should continue to get a free PCR test and lateral flow tests can still be used for asymptomatic testing.

## PTFA

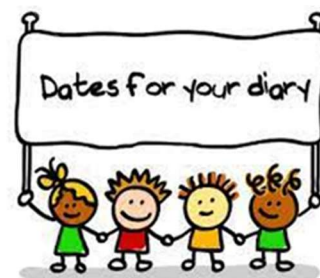
