

#### Ukraine



## COVID-19 update

As you have been informed this week, there has been several cases of COVID -19 across the school and I have been in close contact with Public Health Dorset. We are continuing to ensure everyone practises good hand and respiratory hygiene; we are ensuring good ventilation of indoor spaces and maintaining appropriate cleaning regimes. Currently the guidance is:

# Stay at home if you have COVID-19

Although the legal requirement to self-isolate has ended, people who test positive for COVID-19 or have symptoms of the virus should continue to stay at home and avoid contact with other people.

Children and young people with COVID-19 should not attend their education setting while they are infectious. **They should take an LFD test from 5 days after their symptoms started** (or the day their test was taken if they did not have symptoms) followed by another one the next day. If both these tests results are negative, they should return to their educational setting if they normally attend one, as long as they feel well enough to do so and do not have a temperature. They should follow the guidance for their educational setting.

#### **Close contacts**

Close contacts of confirmed cases are no longer advised to take daily lateral flow tests, but they should take steps to reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19. Read more about what to do if you are a close contact.

## **Testing**

The Government no longer recommends twice-weekly asymptomatic testing in mainstream education and childcare settings.

At present, anyone with symptoms should continue to get a free PCR test and lateral flow tests can still be used for asymptomatic testing.

#### **PTFA**

The PTFA met last week to discuss upcoming opportunities for fundraising events. It was agreed that there would be a school event on the last day of term, before we break up for the Easter holidays. Nothing has been finalised as yet, but some of the



ideas included: Easter egg raffle, Easter egg hunt, bake sale and uniform sale (for summer uniform). There will be another meeting on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> March at 2pm. If you have any good condition school uniform that your children have grown out of, please bring it to school for our uniform sale.



## Red Nose Day – Friday 18th March

We're very conscious of the fact that we have been asking you to donate to CAFOD in support of those in need due to the war in Ukraine; however, we will be joining with the national Red Nose Day event on Friday. We are asking for a donation of £1 and the children can come to school in non-uniform, with
