
Parents Evening

Start and end of day

I know that in my last newsletter, I said that from the week beginning 27th September, we were looking to reduce this lost learning time by changing the times. Please accept my sincere apologies for any



confusion I may have caused around this, as we were trying so hard to find a solution that works for all. Thank you for those of you who helped with suggestions. We have decided to trial the following system for the remainder of the half term, which we will monitor closely. **This will start on Monday 4th October.**

Start of the day -

Gate opens at 8:30 and closes at 8:45 - all children to be in class by then for the start of school.

Parents could drop their children off at for the breakfast club from 8am. Working parents can arrive before 8.30 and wait in their parked cars. When the gates open at 8.30am, working parents can drop off and go quickly.

All other parents can drop off between 8.30 - 8.45. Children can play outside until the bell rings (weather permitting).

End of the day -

Gate opens at 3:10 and closes at 3:30.

Parents with 1 child at the school pick up at 3.10pm and parents with 2 or more children pick up at 3.25pm. This will help to stagger the car numbers and congestion.

It would be helpful if parents leaving could give priority to parents trying to arrive to drop off/ pick up their children.

If we can remain patient and polite it will help. Thank you for your continued support and cooperation in this matter – it will always be tricky.

Before and After School Club

Please remember that we have Breakfast Club which starts at 8am every day and costs £2.50 per session.

We also have After School Club which has 3 sessions:

3:15 - 4:15pm - £3.50

3:15 - 5:00pm - £7.50

3:15 - 6:00pm - £10.00

Please use School Money to book your child in for any sessions.
