Anti-Bullying Week

Last week, we celebrated Anti-Bullying Week. School Council led the week, where the children took part in a range of activities. The week started off with the children wearing odd socks to school. On Tuesday, the children took part in a whole school assembly. Each child had a puzzle piece template and wrote or decorated it to show how they help prevent bullying at St Mary's. They also discussed what makes a perfect friend (e.g. a big pair of ears to show they're a good listener, a big heart to show they care,

hands for kindness, a watch because they always have time for them). During the week, the children were 'Secret Angels', where each child was given another child's name in secret. They then had to do lots of kind acts for them throughout the week (they could also be kind to other people so it didn't look obvious) and then on Friday they were supposed to reveal who their secret angel was; however this wasn't so successful – for a good reason! The week culminated in the children 'reaching out' to children in need, by coming to school wearing (clean) pyjamas, a onesie or spotty clothes and brought a donation for **Children in Need**. 
Colder weather




Celebration Assembly
